




THE CANOPY the North Cumbria Circuit

It was a beautiful day when I set off to climb Helvellyn, no need to use a map or guide book. A good path you can follow even in the dark but halfway up a thick mist came up the valley, not only I couldn't see the summit but I couldn't see the path. In thick mist you lose your sense of direction and awareness of where you are. Looking into the mist everything is exaggerated and distorted; I once thought I had discovered a major new valley in the lake district only to find it was just a shallow gully, another time it was a boulder that looked like a cliff face. Walking in the mist, it's easy to give up, thinking what is the point in going on when there is no view and it's wet and cold, the temptation is to go back down the hill to a safe comfortable place.

When you don't know where you are going and can't see the way ahead its easy to get discouraged and exhausted by the effort of dealing with change. I was rescued by a breath of wind that

blew the mist away and I could stride ahead to the summit to enjoy blue skies and breath taking views. God works and leads us in unexpected ways, we need the breath of God to blow away a few cobwebs and lead us on the way ahead to fulfil our calling and mission.

Redgers, then we met at the Community Centre for the role call ,and laying of the wreaths at the Cenotaph.









Sanctuary and Soul

Since the digital project started in September we have been getting ready to launch, which we achieved at the start of Advent, meaning the last few weeks have been rather frantic.

The project is split into two halves, one seeking to offer an online space for spiritual conversations, open to any kind of spirituality and aiming to be a neutral space. Within this space there will be a clear push towards social action and loving our neighbour.

The other half is an intentionally Christian space, aiming to build an online Christian community with the same goal of loving our neighbour, but being quite clear that we do it because Jesus asked us to do it.

The vision for the Sanctuary and Soul project revolved around an old ruined abbey, where people who wouldn't come through the church door would be happy wandering in this spiritual space (a little like Fountains Abbey or any other such ruin). Alongside this, one of the side chapels is still standing, and this is where we still hold Christian worship. Trying to create this feel and image online will be one of the challenges, but a fun one to try and overcome.

Our ultimate hope is that everyone will, one day, go through the door from the ruin to the chapel. We know from the real world that this is not always the case, and so a community of people who believe that we share a spiritual existence, and who end up living out Jesus command of loving one another, and ultimately making the world a better, and more just, place, can only be a good thing.

So far we have gone live on Facebook and Instagram for the abbey ruins and Facebook and TikTok for the chapel. The easiest way to check these out is through the website <u>www.sanctuaryandsoul.org</u>

Now that we have the content, the next challenge will be to start building the community.

The Family Parade Service on the third Sunday in the month has for the past year been held in the less formal setting of the hall and this has encouraged the children from the youth organisations and their parents to join us in a relaxing Christian time together. The service lasts about three quarters of an hour with modern and occasionally traditional hymns on the screen, some craft, quizzes, the Word and refreshments, perhaps a bacon roll, croissants, toast, and this month mince pies with a drink.
